kids and parents to help families cultivate faithfilled moments. She lives with her husband and three boys in Sherwood Park.





movement. He and his wife have eleven children and they have been home educating for about 30 years.



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


### 1:00-2:00pm | KEYNOTE: Pro Homeschool Hacks - Rebecca Spooner (Prairie)

#### **Striving for Educational Freedom in Alberta:** AHEA and the Defence of Parental Rights Michael Wagner (Salon A)

In the late 1970s and throughout the 1980s, Alberta was at the centre of the debate about parental rights in education. There were a number of court cases, government reports, considerable media discussion, and plenty of general political conflict over matters related to private schools and home education. It was in the midst of this tumultuous period that the Alberta Home Education Association (AHEA) was formed by brave parents who saw the need to defend the rights of families who chose to home educate their children. Understanding this historical background is essential to appreciating the kinds of pressures and opposition Christian parents faced when considering the education they desired for their children. Further threats to home education are on the horizon from academics and activists. We should be aware of this and prepare ourselves for the challenges to come.

#### The Goal of Education

### Rev. Nate Wright (Trailblazer 1 - Upstairs)

Too often educators, including homeschool parents think the goal of education is to graduate good students... we have to reclaim what education used to be (before government overreach took it over) and that is graduating good and competent PEOPLE. Education by necessity must teach virtue, must enable the student to know right from wrong, truth from lies and beauty from ugliness.

## **Teaching History with Headphone History (Trailblazer 2 - Upstairs)**

Learn how to teach elementary history with this flexible Canadian history curriculum created by a homeschooler for homeschoolers. Above all, our training should remind ourselves and our children every day how much we need Jesus.

## The Marriage Talk Rebecca Spooner (Salon B)

Join Jonathan and Rebecca as they share real, relatable, funny, and even hard stories of their nearly 19 years of marriage. Sparks fly as iron sharpens iron in this tale of two strong (somewhat stubborn) leaders who came together to build a life: learning how to parent, homeschool, and communicate. Hear from them as they reconcile the stark contrast between following Jonathan's calling in the RCMP for 15 years and then transitioning to following Rebecca's calling in the homeschool world. They will share how they keep their marriage strong and some of the pitfalls they have learned to avoid. In a not-so-typical love story twist, hear how two people who were far-too-alike and had way too much spit-fire found (by the grace of God) beauty in the ashes.

Depictions, many new to the creation community, provide powerful evidence that the Bible's account of history in Genesis is accurate - people and these allegedly extinct creatures lived together recently. Most Christians desire to be able to present their faith to others. But they are often held back from this because they aren't confident in their ability to answer questions that involve science and faith. There are Four Powerful Words that if understood correctly will help you to navigate the debate that rages around Genesis, our origins, and the Flood. And these words can be applied to every single scientific question or debate. They will help you to confidently answer many of the intimidating questions used by modern scientists that confuse those who trust the Scriptures.

## 3:30-4:30pm KEYNOTE: Raising Reluctant Writers Rebecca Spooner (Prairie)

One of the most difficult hurdles that homeschool parents face is teaching their children to read and write especially considering the increase in learning challenges that have to be accounted for. Language arts has become a dreaded subject amongst many families, with never ending rules to be taught and systems to be followed. 

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



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# Exhibit Hall Floor Plan



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


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
